To amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to prohibit payments under the Medicaid program for conversion therapy, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- This Act may be cited as the "Prohibition of Med-
- 5 icaid Funding for Conversion Therapy Act.".

1	SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON MEDICAID PAYMENTS FOR CON-
2	VERSION THERAPY.
3	(a) In General.—Section 1902 of the Social Secu-
4	rity Act (42 U.S.C. 1396a) is amended—
5	(1) in subsection (a)—
6	(A) in paragraph (82), by striking "and"
7	at the end;
8	(B) in paragraph (83), by striking the pe-
9	riod at the end and inserting "; and"; and
10	(C) by inserting after paragraph (83) the
11	following new paragraph:
12	"(84) provide that, beginning with the first day
13	of the first quarter that begins on or after the date
14	of enactment of this paragraph, no payment may be
15	made under the plan with respect to conversion ther-
16	apy (as defined in subsection (nn)) furnished to an
17	individual enrolled under the plan (or a waiver of
18	such plan) on or after such first day."; and
19	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
20	section:
21	"(nn) Conversion Therapy; Gender Identity;
22	Person; Sexual Orientation.—For purposes of sub-
23	section (a)(84) and this subsection:
24	"(1) Conversion therapy.—The term 'con-
25	version therapy'—

1	"(A) means any practice or treatment by
2	any person that seeks to change another indi-
3	vidual's sexual orientation or gender identity,
4	including efforts to change behaviors or gender
5	expressions, or to eliminate or reduce sexual or
6	romantic attractions or feelings toward individ-
7	uals of the same gender, if such person receives
8	monetary compensation in exchange for any
9	such practice or treatment; and
10	"(B) does not include any practice or
11	treatment, which does not seek to change sexual
12	orientation or gender identity, that—
13	"(i) provides assistance to an indi-
14	vidual undergoing a gender transition; or
15	"(ii) provides acceptance, support,
16	and understanding of a client or facilita-
17	tion of a client's coping, social support,
18	and identity exploration and development,
19	including sexual orientation-neutral inter-
20	ventions to prevent or address unlawful
21	conduct or unsafe sexual practices.
22	"(2) GENDER IDENTITY.—The term 'gender
23	identity' means the gender-related identity, appear-
24	ance, mannerisms, or other gender-related character-

1	istics of an individual, regardless of the individual's
2	designated sex at birth.
3	"(3) Person.—The term 'person' means any
4	individual, partnership, corporation, cooperative, as-
5	sociation, or any other entity.
6	"(4) Sexual orientation.—The term 'sexual
7	orientation' means homosexuality, heterosexuality, or
8	bisexuality.".
9	(b) Conforming Amendment.—Section 1903(i) of
10	the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396b(i)) is amended
11	by inserting after paragraph (8) the following new para-
12	graph:
13	"(9) with respect to any amount expended for
14	conversion therapy (as defined in section 1902(nn))
15	on or after the date described in section
16	1902(a)(84); or".
